So why don't you have a go at the puzzles below, which have ideas on the things we need to do to stay safe.

There are some simple rules to help us cross the roads, which this family seem to be following.

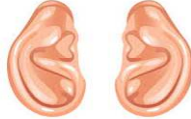

3. Cross when it's safe, but keep looking and listening and never **R** _ _

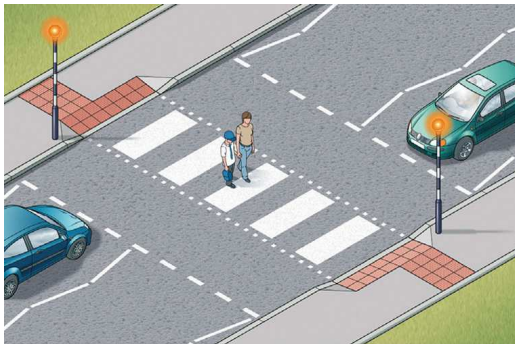


What's the missing word? Can you write down why should we never do this?

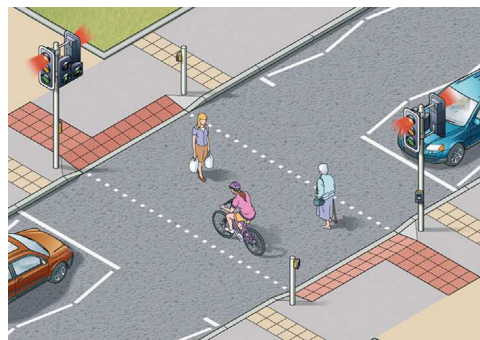

You may have thought of some crossings when thinking of safe places to cross the road. See if you can label the following types of Pedestrian Crossings.

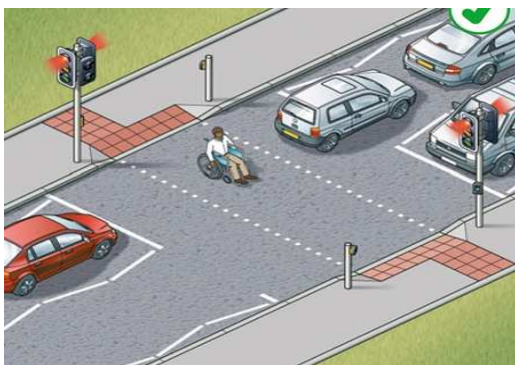
We've given some clues below.

You may not know them all, so maybe an adult can help you.

Here are some clues:

Z _ _ _ _ it's black and white like this animal with 4 legs.

T _ _ _ _ A crossing where you can ride your bike. It's also a bird with a very big beak.

P _ _ _ _ It's the one where the red and green man are in the box next to the button you press.
It's also a small bird with a colourful beak that eats fish. (It is not a pelican).

P _ _ _ _ _ It's a crossing where you can ride across on your horse. It's also a horse that can fly!

Answers:

Safe Places to Cross:

- We can cross at any pedestrian crossing, that is made for people to cross
- We can also cross with a lollipop lady or man

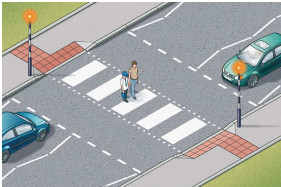
The missing words are:

- Stop – We must stop so that we can look and listen properly
- Look – We are looking for traffic,
- Listen – We also need to listen for traffic. We can sometimes hear vehicles before we see them
- Traffic can come from lots of places. Left or right, from around a corner, or from a driveway

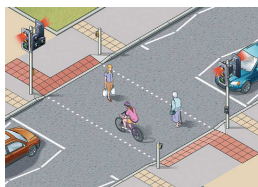
When it is safe to cross, we should walk, but never run because:

- We could fall in the road
- We can't look and listen properly if we are running

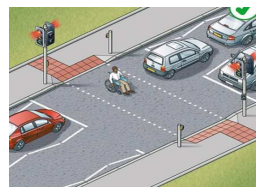
